TIMELINE & IMPACT ON MICHIGAN | METRO DETROIT

Key Dates & Federal Timeline

- 2026: Medicaid work requirements begin to take effect.
- 2027: Medicaid & SNAP cuts begin.
- 2028: Medicaid expansion incentives begin to be phased down.
- 2028-2034: Funding erodes further-impacting hospitals, food access, and disability income.

MICHIGAN IMPACT: AT A GLANCE

- 238,000 MICHIGANDERS could lose Medicaid coverage.
- NEARLY 500,000 ENROLLEES IN WAYNE COUNTY alone are at risk.
 MORE THAN 46% OF DETROITERS are enrolled.
- CUTS COULD AFFECT
 - 39% of children
 - 40% of births
 - 63% of nursing home residents.
- NEARLY 1.5 MILLION MICHIGANDERS receive SNAP benefits around 15% of the population.
 - More than 59% of those receiving benefits are families with children
 - 46% are working families
- HUNDREDS OF HEALTHCARE WORKERS face layoffs.
- RURAL AND URBAN HOSPITALS brace for closure.

METRO DETROIT HOSPITAL SYSTEMS AT RISK

Safety-net institutions such as Detroit Receiving, Henry Ford, Sinai-Grace, and Beaumont Wayne/Dearborn face reduced reimbursements, potential staff cuts and department shutdowns.

FOOD INSECURITY WILL EXPLODE

Communities like Highland Park, Inkster, and Southfield are expected to experience a dramatic rise in hunger as SNAP is slashed and more families fall through eligibility cracks. School meal programs, food banks, and churches are already preparing for overflow.

RIPPLE EFFECTS

- Higher premiums and deductibles for privately insured families.
- State and local governments may be forced to raise health levies or cut essential services.
- Gaps in elder care, addiction treatment, and maternal health will widen.



THE STAKES FOR METRO DETROIT AND MICHIGAN ARE ENORMOUS.
